❖ **1ST CONDITIONALS:**
If it rains, I will stay at home.
(If simple present, will future)

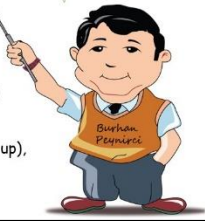
❖ **2ND CONDITIONALS:**
If I won the lottery, I would buy a big house.
(If simple past, would do)

Examples for the exercise:

If I **were** (be) an alien, I **would** (travel) around the universe. (2nd Conditional)

Hey! You're walking very slowly. If we **don't hurry up** (not hurry up), we **will be** (be) late. (1st Conditional)
